House Bill 6948: An Act Concerning The Collateral Consequences Of Criminal Records On Housing Opportunities

Hello Senator Marx, Representative Felipe, Ranking Members Senator Sampson and Representative Scott, and all the distinguished members of the Housing Committee.

My name is Annette Diaz, I am a resident of Vernon, an enrollment specialist for a healthcare provider, a Recovery Support Specialist, and most importantly a mother. I am here to testify in support of HB 6948: An Act Concerning the Collateral Consequences of Criminal Records on Housing Opportunities.

As a person who has been directly impacted by the criminal legal system in Connecticut, as well as the collateral consequences of living with a record, I have experienced first-hand the barriers that people face when trying to find a place to live, trying to find employment, trying to find healthcare, and trying to provide a better life for my daughter. To me, HB 6948 is not only about giving people who are searching for an apartment while living with a past conviction, it's about their families who may depend on them, like my daughter depends on me.

Despite over a decade passing since my conviction, despite the programs I've completed (as well as the programs I have coordinated and run), and all the steps I've taken to rebuild my life, it is a undisputable fact that my record continues to shadow everything I do, and unfortunately, it hangs over my daughter as well. To me it isn't fair that a landlord could deny me an apartment based merely on a criminal record from my past, particularly when I've completed my sentence, paid my debt to society, and have not had any arrests in the time since. I believe that HB 6948 give people who are doing the rights things a real opportunity to show that they are not what it says on a background check and that they, as well as their children, deserve an opportunity to be a tenant.
